


Some chords simply sound good together. You've probably heard someone say "That's a D, C, G song," or talk about three chords and the truth. BEAD Guides Chord Flow maps out what those three chords are (other than the D, G, and C, which I mentioned. But the guitar is a great map too. I'll show you. For instance, here's G and C which are neighbors in BEAD Guides Chord Flow:




Let's focus simply on the notes chords are named for.


They are colored in.

Do you see how these notes are neighbors on the guitar?






Here's a second example.
The E and A chords are on neighboring strings too.
I imagine you can see where this is going.



Every note that's a neighbor in BEAD Guides Chord Flow is a neighbor on the guitar as well!
