




The Rainbow Connection was written for The Muppet Movie by Kenneth Ascher and Paul Williams. It's a classic song that uses a classic chord progression called Rhythm Changes. (Rhythm Changes got its name from the chord progression of "I've Got Rhythm.")

One way to think about Rhythm
Changes is to compare it to the
chords from The Axis of Awesome.
They are G's neighbors in BEAD
Guides Chord Flow, D and C, as well as
G's related minor chord, Em.



Rhythm Changes uses all the same chords, but instead of using G's major neighbor on the right, c, it uses the related minor of C, Am.



You also might notice that Rhythm Changes starts on a major chord, changes to its related minor, and then cycles through BEAD Guides Chord Flow until it returns to the original chord.
